Advent Colors: Purple recalls the Royalty of the present and coming King, and the candles recall the Light of the world, Jesus Christ.


Service of Lessons and Carols

This morning's worship is a service of lessons and carols. Tradition suggests that in the late 19th century the Bishop of Truro in Cornwall, England designed a Christmas Eve service to lift the spirits of his poor congregation. They met in a wooden shed that served as their church sanctuary. The bishop used scripture readings from the Old and New Testaments to unfold the story of how God came to earth as a baby. In between the scripture lessons, the bishop inserted familiar Christmas songs and carols.

Light the Advent Candle



All: Prepare the way of the Lord.


- Reader: We light the third candle as a sign of the **joy** that Christ gives through His saving grace.

God tells sinful Adam that he has lost the life of Paradise and that his seed will bruise the serpent's head. From Genesis 3

Reader: And they heard the sound of the LORD God walking in the garden in the cool of the day, and the man and his wife hid themselves from the presence of the LORD God among the trees of the garden. 

ourth Lesson: Peace Reigns


Ranya Sweis The peace that Christ will bring is foreshown. From Isaiah 11

- Reader: In the sixth month the angel Gabriel was sent from God to a city of Galilee named Nazareth, to a virgin betrothed to a man whose name was Joseph, of the house of David. And the virgin's name was Mary. And he came to her and said, "Greetings, O favored one, the Lord is with you!" Reader:

In those days a decree went out from Caesar Augustus that all the world should be registered. This was the first registration when Quirinius was governor of Syria. Reader: And in the same region there were shepherds out in the field, keeping watch over their flock by night. And an angel of the Lord appeared to them, and the glory of the Lord shone around them, and they were filled with fear. And the angel said to them, "Fear not, for behold, I bring you good news of great joy that will be for all the people. For unto you is born this day in the city of David a Savior, who is Christ the Lord. And this will be a sign for you: you will find a baby wrapped in swaddling cloths and lying in a manger." 

Reader: Now after Jesus was born in Bethlehem of Judea in the days of Herod the king, behold, wise men from the east came to Jerusalem, saying, "Where is he who has been born king of the Jews? For we saw his star when it rose and have come to worship him." When Herod the king heard this, he was troubled, and all Jerusalem with him; and assembling all the chief priests and scribes of the people, he inquired of them where the Christ was to be born. They told him, "In Bethlehem of Judea, for so it is written by the prophet: "'And you, O Bethlehem, in the land of Judah, are by no means least among the rulers of Judah; for from you shall come a ruler who will shepherd my people Israel.'"

Then Herod summoned the wise men secretly and ascertained from them what time the star had appeared. And he sent them to Bethlehem, saying, "Go and search diligently for the child, and when you have found him, bring me word, that I too may come and worship him." After listening to the king, they went on their way. And behold, the star that they had seen when it rose went before them until it came to rest over the place where the child was. When they saw the star, they rejoiced exceedingly with great joy. And going into the house they saw the child with Mary his mother, and they fell down and worshiped him. Then, opening their treasures, they offered him gifts, gold and frankincense and myrrh. And being warned in a dream not to return to Herod, they departed to their own country by another way.

Reader: In the beginning was the Word,

All: and the Word was with God, and the Word was God.

Reader: He was with God in the beginning.

All: Through him all things were made; without him nothing was made that has been made.

Reader: In him was life, and that life was the light of men.

All: The light shines in the darkness, but the darkness has not overcome it.

Reader: There came a man who was sent from God; his name was John. He came as a witness to testify concerning that light, so that through him all men might believe. He himself was not the light; he came only as a witness to the light.



Receiving Communion


