Leader: Awake, O harp and lyre!


All: I will awake the dawn!

All: I will teach transgressors your ways, and sinners will return to you.



Pastor David Salsedo Kingdom Peace, Philippians 4.2-9



[4] Rejoice in the Lord always; again I will say, rejoice. [5] Let your reasonableness be known to everyone. The Lord is at hand; [6] do not be anxious about anything, but in everything by prayer and supplication with thanksgiving let your requests be made known to God. [7] And the peace of God, which surpasses all understanding, will guard your hearts and your minds in Christ Jesus.


