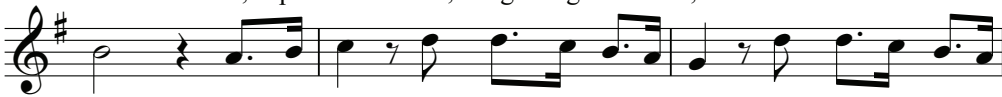



Covenant Life Class: Join us for our Covenant Life Class taught by the staff. This class, which meets in the Conference Room, is for those who are interested in learning more about the church and the things we care about most, starting with the gospel.
