Leader: Lift up your hearts


All: We lift them up to the Lord.

and in his resurrection we see how you draw us close





Christ has died, Christ is risen, Christ will come again.




# The Work of the People

No Classes During Common Ground: Covenant Sunday schools, Common Ground nurseries and adult classes will take a break today for the holiday weekend. Please join us between services for bagels in the Fellowship Hall. All regular Common Ground activities will resume next week.

Waiting: The church waits expectantly for Christ to complete his work in us and our world. We are all waiting for something. What does it look like for us to wait faithfully? In this three-week Advent class taught by women on the Spiritual Formation team, we will explore our own seasons of waiting and how God meets us in them.
